RESOLUTION of the Matawa Chiefs Council passed at the 25th Annual Matawa Chiefs Assembly in Long Lake #58 to be effective from and after 9:00am Eastern Standard time on 1st of August 2013

SUPPORT FOR REMOTE TRAINING CENTRE CONSTRUCTION IN MATAWA MEMBER FIRST NATIONS

WHEREAS, Kiikenomaga Kikenjigewen Employment and Training Services (KKETS) identified a need to provide local access to community-based education, trades and apprenticeship training for Matawa member First Nations in northern and remote areas surrounding mining development; and

WHEREAS, KKETS has good intentions to build remote training centres in remote communities for local Matawa member First Nations; and

WHEREAS, the remote training centres will be about 20 by 44 feet with 24-classroom seats, a kitchen, washroom, an office and a coat room and are designed to be flown in by an aircraft in pieces and assembled onsite; and

WHEREAS, by utilizing state of the art computerized technology systems and high-speed satellite broadband internet, the remote training centres will be able to connect to e-learning tools and programs; and

WHEREAS, KKETS is connected with other colleges and universities that could also develop e-learning for the remote training centres; and

WHEREAS, the ultimate goal is after the training is complete the students would be apprentices who could work on projects close to their communities in resource development or mining and raise a family within their community; and

WHEREAS, Neskantaga First Nation was identified as the site for the first training centre, Eabametoong First Nation as the site of the second training centre, and Constance Lake First Nation as the site of the third training centre.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the delegates of the 25th Annual Matawa Chiefs Assembly support KKETS to construct the training centres in Neskantaga First Nation, Eabametoong First Nation and Constance Lake First Nation.
