GENERAL INFORMATION:

Matawa First Nations Management is a Tribal Council with a membership of nine (9) Ojibwe and Cree First Nations communities in the Nishnawbe Aski Nation territory. The First Nation communities served are Aroland, Constance Lake, Eabametoong, Long Lake #58, Ginoogaming, Neskantaga, Nibinamik, Marten Falls and Webequie.

MATAWA FIRST NATIONS MANAGEMENT MISSION:

Matawa First Nations are committed to supporting each other and focusing their collective efforts on core strategic priorities. By working together as a regional community, we will use our combined knowledge and resources in order to champion the social and economic vitality of our First Nations and invest in community and people building.

THE MATAWA EDUCATION DEPARTMENT:

The role of the Matawa Education Department is to support educational initiatives that promote educational excellence and positively impact the quality of education in Matawa First Nations' schools and to its students. Supporting Matawa First Nations' education authorities while networking with Aboriginal organizations, Indigenous Services Canada, the Provincial Ministry of Education, and Post Secondary, Secondary, and Elementary Institutions is an important responsibility of the Matawa Education Department.

BOWMANVILLE ROTARY CLUB:

Leadership, initiative, perseverance, and community involvement are qualities being instilled with this bursary program.





Elementary/Secondary Awards Categories

OPEN TO ALL MATAWA FIRST NATION ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS AND STUDENTS

These awards promote creativity in reading, writing, oral language, and media literacy. All successful recipients will have their work displayed at the award ceremony as well as published in the Rotary Recipient Booklet.

JUNIOR KINDERGARTEN AND SENIOR KINDERGARTEN (ENGLISH OR NATIVE LANGUAGE) \$400

The class will choose ONE of the following:

- · write and illustrate a legend or narrative in book form
- use multimedia to capture a class: play, song, puppet show, dance, interview, photo album, slide show, movie, etc...
- create a board game or card game

For the JK - SK entries, signed parental consent forms are required to enable Matawa Education department to publish and distribute the story to all Matawa communities.

Required items:

- Application and consent forms
- Class submission
- Recent class picture

GRADES 1-2 (ENGLISH OR NATIVE LANGUAGE) \$400

The class will choose ONE of the following:

- write and illustrate a legend or a narrative
- use multimedia to capture a class: play, song, puppet show, dance, interview, photo album, slide show, movie, etc...
- · create a board game or card game

For the Gr 1 and 2 entries, signed parental consent forms are required to enable Matawa Education department to publish and distribute the story to all Matawa communities.

Required items:

- Application and consent forms
- Class submission
- Recent class picture

GRADES 3-5 (ENGLISH OR NATIVE LANGUAGE)

1st place recipient - iPad 2nd place recipient - iPod

The student will write or use multimedia to create <u>ONE</u> of the following:

- a narrative based on a community legend
- a poem or song that is culturally relevant
- a recount of an accomplishment

The top two (2) entries will be published in our bursary booklet.

Required items:

- Application and consent forms
- Class submission
- Recent picture of student

GRADES 6-8 (ENGLISH OR NATIVE LANGUAGE) 1st place recipient - iPad 2nd place recipient - iPod

The student will write or use multimedia to create <u>ONE</u> of the following:

- a 200 word persuasive essay OR a 5-7 minute video interview based on a current issue in a community or in the region
- a 200 word autobiography highlighting athletics, cultural activities, or leadership opportunities that have been taken
- an ORIGINAL creative writing, or multimedia piece

The top two (2) entries will be published in our bursary booklet.

Elementary/Secondary Awards Categories

OPEN TO ALL MATAWA FIRST NATION INTERMEDIATE GRADES AND SECONDARY STUDENTS AS SPECIFIED IN EACH CATEGORY

These awards promote youth leadership and personal achievement.

NATIVE LANGUAGE \$500 (GRADES 7 - 12)

Entries must be fictional stories from the community, and written in syllabics or roman orthography, <u>OR</u> captured as an oral telling and spoken in the Native Language using multimedia

- 2 or more pages for written
- 5 10 minutes for multimedia

Required items to be included with submission:

- Application
- Recent picture of the student

CREATIVE WRITING \$500 (GRADES 9 - 12)

Applicants will submit an ORIGINAL creative writing piece that has not, in any part, been copied from any source.

• 300 or more words

Required items to be included with submission:

- Application
- Recent picture of the student

MULTIMEDIA WITH WRITTEN EXPLANATION \$500 (GRADES 9 - 12)

Applicants are encouraged to consider the question, "What motivates you in high school?" and convey their answer through a medium of their choosing (examples: audio, visual, electronic). A written explanation must accompany the entry, as the judges will be evaluating the written explanation as well.

• 200 words or more for the written portion

Required items to be included with submission:

- Application
- Recent picture of the student

MATAWA EDUCATION CENTRE AWARD \$500

Students at the Matawa Education Centre who demonstrate hard work and perseverance through leadership or achievement in academics, athletics, work, cultural activities, or lifestyle choices are eligible.

Applicants will submit an essay describing how they have demonstrated the requirements of the award

- 300 or more words
- include your: name, home community, grade, age, school, educational goals, achievements, etc...
- may also include optional supporting documents such as: newspaper articles, transcript, certificates of recognition, etc...

Required items to be included with submission:

- Application
- Recent picture of the student



Post-secondary Awards Categories

OPEN TO ALL MATAWA FIRST NATIONS POST-SECONDARY STUDENTS

Two \$1,000 Bursaries will be awarded in this category – one for college and one for university students.

COLLEGE BURSARY \$1000 UNIVERSITY BURSARY \$1000

Applicants at the post-secondary level may apply for this bursary on a yearly basis. Students who demonstrate determination, commitment and achievement in their chosen career path are encouraged to apply.

CONTINUING POST-SECONDARY EDUCATION

BURSARY (amount of the award will fluctuate with each year based on the bursary return)

Applicants at the post-secondary level may apply for the continuing education bursary on a yearly basis. Students must have successfully completed their year of studies with a minimum GPA of 3.0. Proof of registration to a maximum of a 4-year program and an official transcript will be required before this bursary is granted. This scholarship is renewable for up to 3 years provided that the student: a) maintains a 3.0 GPA,

b) is registered for a full course load, and c) submits a completed reapplication form the following year.

Required documentation:

- Application and Consent Forms.
- Written documentation of how your program has assisted you in pursuing your career goals and helped you make some positive contributions to your home and community (750 words).

Please include:

- An introduction with your name, home community, institution, program and year, and any other pertinent information about yourself.
- Educational and personal goals.
- · Career plans.
- A letter of recommendation from a current instructor or professor.
- Optional supporting documents: newspaper articles, transcript or other samples, certificates of recognition.
- A recent picture of yourself.



















Training, Apprenticeship and Trades Award Categories

OPEN TO ALL MATAWA FIRST NATION TRAINING, APPRENTICESHIP, ADULT EDUCATION, AND TRADES STUDENTS WHO ARE INVOLVED IN A PROGRAM THAT IS MORE THAN 6 WEEKS IN DURATION.

A \$1,000 Bursary will be awarded in this category for one student that is enrolled in a training, adult education, apprenticeship or trades program that is 6 weeks or more in duration. Applicants in these programs may apply for this bursary on a yearly basis.

The goal of this bursary is to assist and support Matawa First Nation students in achieving their personal employment, training and educational aspirations.

Applicants who demonstrate determination, commitment and achievement in their chosen career path are encouraged to apply.

Required documentation:

- Application and Consent Forms.
- Written documentation of how your program has assisted you in pursuing your career goals and helped you make some positive contributions to your home and community (750 words).

Please include:

- An introduction with your name, home community, institution, program and year
- o Career plans and personal goals.
- A letter of recommendation from a current instructor or professor.
- A copy of your certification.
- Optional supporting documents: newspaper articles, transcript or other samples, certificates of recognition.
- A recent picture of yourself
