


JORDAN WABASSE MEMORIAL AWARDS CELEBRATING MATAWA STUDENT EXCELLENCE IN ATHLETICS & OUTDOOR EDUCATION







The Jordan Wabasse Memorial Awards were established during the 2017-2018 academic year by Jordan Wabasse's family, Webequie Education Authority, and the Matawa Education and Care Centre in tribute to the late Jordan Wabasse. The awards are in memory of Jordan Wabasse, a youth from Webequie First Nation, a student of the Matawa Learning Centre (now Matawa Education and Care Centre), and a dedicated hockey player and hunter whose life tragically ended far too soon in 2011.

As a result of this tragedy and six other tragedies in Thunder Bay, the Seven Youth Inquest was held in which 124 recommendations were made for improvements in education for remote First Nations youth attending high schools in Thunder Bay. As a result, 24 of those recommendations were directed to the MLC (now MECC) including this award in Jordan's honour. Therefore, with support from Jordan's family and community, our leadership, and Ontario we are happy to announce that Jordan's dedication, commitment and passion for sports and outdoor education inspires six memorial awards amounted to a \$1000 each for students who excel in Athletics or Outdoor Education.

The six memorial awards will be distributed to graduating students attending either Simon Jacob Memorial Education Centre or Keewaytinook Internet High School in Webequie First Nation, Matawa Education and Care Centre in Thunder Bay, and Provincial High Schools in Thunder Bay. Students attending schools who are not in a formal Athletics or Outdoor Education program in school are encouraged to apply if they enjoy being out on the land or playing sports as Jordan so lovingly did.
