Position: Community Health Nurse

Background:

Incorporated in 2017, the Matawa Health Co-operative (MHC) is a Matawa First Nation owned and controlled health co-operative that provides health care services to enhance existing health services to achieve long-term health and well-being for all members within the nine (9) Matawa First Nations. It is overseen by a Board of Directors and is a member of the Health Care Co-operatives Federation of Canada. The MHC is community-driven with available services being tailored to individual community's needs. It is the first of its kind in Canada.

The MHC works to incorporate traditional healing and medicines in addressing the wholistic health needs of the Matawa First Nations focusing on the priorities of mental health and addictions, diabetes and chronic diseases. It oversees an Inter-Professional Primary Care Health Team made up of a clinical coordinator, 12 nurses (2 are Certified Diabetes Educators), 3 physicians, a foot care nurse, 1 nurse practitioner, and 7 mental health counsellors providing direct services in the Matawa First Nations or through telemedicine.

Position Summary:

Under the direction, guidance and supervision provided by the Clinical Supervisor, the Community Health Nurse is responsible for health programming to all Matawa First Nations communities, focusing on disease prevention and promotion, and education:

- Planning and delivering a Community Health Program, taking into consideration our indigenous culture and traditional values which influence individual, family and community;
- Delivering an immunization programs in accordance to FNIHB Immunization Policy and Procedures and Ministry Standards. Also, ensuring to maintain a communicable disease reporting program in collaboration with CD Nurse of FNIHB and Clinical Manager;
- 3. Delivering the following community health programs in accordance with FNIHB Nursing Manuals, (Preconception Health, Prenatal Health, Maternal-Newborn Health, Infant and Preschool Health, School Health and Community Health Services);
- 4. Providing screening clinics for chronic diseases and prioritized health education and promotion sessions to individuals, and community groups;
- 5. Delivering community health services in group or individual settings, such as, in home and/or designated community sites, community health facility, and the community hall/center;

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- Developing and maintaining positive relationships with individuals, families, the First Nation staff (CHR, FSW, HPW, PSW, etc), FNIHB nursing staff, Leaders of the community and clarifying Matawa Health Services policies and professional requirements when required;
- 7. Supporting the First Nations in development of safe efficient health facilities/operations;
- 8. Participating in the ongoing quality assurance process;

Preferred Qualifications, Experience, Knowledge and Abilities:

• In addition to the following, the Community Health Nurse must possess at minimum: a bachelor's degree in nursing; or minimum of three-year nursing diploma will be accepted with a minimum of 2 years of nursing work experience.

Applicants will have skills and personal attributes as described in the job description including excellent oral and written communication skills; interpersonal skills.
