## **OPTIONS TO ENHANCE SUPPORTS FOR BOARDING HOME PROGRAMS**

WHEREAS most students from isolated Matawa First Nations attend secondary school in Thunder Bay and reside in boarding homes during the school year; and

WHEREAS secondary school students receive insufficient funding to purchase required school supplies and to pay for after-school school activities in the community; and

WHEREAS secondary school students in Thunder Bay have experienced racism in various forms and situations with different groups;

**THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that the Matawa Chiefs in Assembly direct the Matawa Education Department to explore alternative options to provide supplementary funding for Matawa students residing with boarding home parents; and

**FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED** that the Matawa Chiefs in Assembly direct the Matawa Education Department to explore alternative options address issues of racism in Thunder Bay that affect Matawa students; and

**FINALLY BE IT RESOLVED** that the Matawa Chiefs in Assembly direct the Matawa Education Department to present these options to the Matawa Chiefs at their December 2015 Meeting.
