SUPPORT FOR THE ABORIGINAL SKILLS ADVANCEMENT PROGRAM TO SERVICE MATAWA FIRST NATION MEMBERS AGES 18 YEARS AND OLDER

WHEREAS Kiikenomaga Kikenjigewen Employment & Training Services (KKETS) is funded by the Ministry of Advanced Education and Skills Development from April, 1 2018 to June 30, 2019, and;

WHEREAS the Aboriginal Skills and Advancement Program (ASAP) assists and prepares 100 Matawa First Nations members annually in obtaining a Grade 12 Ontario Secondary School Diploma for the pursuit of post-secondary education, training and employment opportunities, and;

WHEREAS the ASAP Program services Matawa First Nation members aged 22 years and greater and where currently there are obstacles for membership aged 18 to 21 years to access adult education, and;

WHEREAS individual applicants from Matawa First Nations under the age of 22 years have expressed an interest to fill out an application to participate in ASAP, so;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Matawa Chiefs in Assembly support the ASAP to change its age requirements to 18 years and older from 22 years and older to all Matawa First Nation members to access adult education where these services may not be readily available.
