RESOLUTION of the Matawa Chiefs passed at the 32nd Annual Matawa Chiefs Assembly in Thunder Bay, Ontario to be effective from and after 1:00pm Eastern Standard time on September 11, 2020

RESOLUTION #04-11-09-2020

SUPPORT FOR THE MATAWA WAKA TERE LANGUAGE PROGRAM

WHEREAS the Matawa Chiefs Council, through *Resolution #11-30-07-15: Language as a Nation Building Tool*, have prioritized the renewal and revitalization of our languages; and

WHEREAS the Year 1 program of the Matawa Waka Tere pilot program in Ojibway has been successfully developed and delivered and students from the pilot program will graduate in September 2020; and

WHEREAS the Matawa Waka Tere method of teaching our language has proven effective, despite delays in the development and implementation of its programming, and additional work supported by the Indigenous Language Revitalization Specialists from New Zealand is required to see the project goals completed; and

WHEREAS continued full-time involvement of the two Indigenous Language Revitalization Specialists, and a language revitalization program administrator, from New Zealand will be essential to completing development and implementation of the Matawa Waka Tere program for all Matawa languages.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Matawa Chiefs Council continue to identify the renewal and revitalization of our languages as a priority for our communities; and

FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED that the Matawa Chiefs Council mandate Matawa Education to continue to work with the two current Indigenous Language Revitalization Specialists from New Zealand in the development and implementation of the Matawa Waka Tere program, including accreditation; and

FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED that the Matawa Chiefs Council mandate Matawa Education to assist in facilitating the extension of the work visas of the two current Indigenous Language Revitalization Specialists from New Zealand for the remainder of the project; and

FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED that the Matawa Chiefs Council mandate Matawa Education to continue to seek funding for the Matawa Waka Tere program through the Aboriginal Language Initiative (ALI) or the NIB Trust Fund (NIBTF), as well as other funding sources; and

FINALLY, BE IT RESOLVED that the Matawa Chiefs Council direct the Matawa Education Department to provide regular updates to the Matawa Chiefs Council on the Matawa Waka Tere program.
