RESOURCES FOR BACK TO OUR ROOTS: CHII KEE WAY MENO BIIMADESEYUNG REVIEW/RECOMMENDATIONS

WHEREAS the Matawa Health & Social Meno Biimadeswin developed Back to Our Roots: Chii Kee Way Meno Biimadeseyung-the Strategy to Overcome Prescription Drug Abuse/Misuse in Matawa Communities (2012) which identified four key areas to address and eleven specific regional initiatives; and

WHEREAS the Matawa Health & Social Meno Biimadeswin have held "Back to Our Roots Gathering" in each Matawa member First Nation; and

WHEREAS the Matawa Health & Social Meno Biimadeswin have conducted a review of the *Back to Our Roots: Chii Kee Way Meno Biimadeseyung Strategy;* and

WHEREAS Matawa member First Nations are experiencing an increase in the use of illicit drugs/new drugs in our communities and by community members as well as an increase in the numbers of overdoses.

THEREFORE, **BE IT RESOLVED** that the Matawa Chiefs Council hereby fully support and endorse the *Review* of Back to Our Roots: Chii Kee Way Meno Biimadeseyung document as presented on September 14, 2021.

FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED, that the Matawa Chiefs Council hereby fully support Matawa Health & Social Meno Biimadeswin to continue addressing the key areas, action for change, new findings and recommendations as identified in the report; and

FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED, that the Matawa Chiefs Council hereby support Matawa Health & Social Meno Biimadeswin to seek and advocate for increased resources for each Matawa First Nation for adequate funding; and
