

AMAZING TWO-SPIRIT COUPLE

Anthony Johnson & Dr. James Makokis

Anthony Johnson and Dr. James Makokis shattered conventional norms as the first-ever Two-Spirit team on the Amazing Race Canada. Their inspiring journey brought critical issues of gender, sexuality, and First Nations experiences to the national spotlight. Demonstrating tenacity, resilience, and indomitable spirit, they triumphed in Season 7, setting a ground-breaking precedent for diverse representation in popular media.

While they may seem inseparable, each brings a unique perspective, a distinct skill set, and a wealth of lived experiences that have shaped them into the advocates they are today. Their intertwined journeys as individuals, as a Two-Spirit couple, and as part of the rich tapestry of their peoples' history, have fueled their work in service and in advocacy. Their focus lies in raising awareness about the challenges faced by First Nation and LGBTQ2S+ communities, and the need for equity and accessibility.

As they traverse Canada, sharing tales of their Amazing Race journey, their community endeavors, and their unique perspectives, they provide insightful recommendations on how to further their cause and challenge oppressive stereotypes. Their mission is to globally unite allies in the pursuit of equal access and fair treatment for the communities they represent.





Melissa Deschamps, Ontario Aboriginal HIV AIDS Strategy

Melissa Deschamps is an Indigenous woman who was born in Thunder Bay, Ontario. She is a Red Rock Indian Band member and her family's clan is the wolf. She is also a mother to 2 beautiful boys.

Melissa has lived experience with mental illness and addictions and has been on her healing journey for about 12 years now. She didn't grow up with the Indigenous culture or traditions but has been learning and embracing the teachings she has received over the last few years. Melissa has been working for Ontario Aboriginal HIV AIDS Strategy since March 2018. She supports Indigenous people living with HIV, HCV and who are at risk.



Cassandra Voets – Child & Youth Mental Health & Wellness Lead with Matawa Health Cooperative

Cassandra is from a small town in Southern Ontario called Blenheim (45 minutes from Canada's southern most point). She moved to Thunder Bay in 2019 after completing her undergrad at

Laurier Brantford in Youth & Children Studies and Human Rights. She also received her Honours Bachelor of Social Work at Lakehead University & completed a placement in art therapy. She has been with Matawa Health Cooperative for almost 2 years now working with Matawa youth. She works in a joint effort with community partners, MHC staff and Matawa youth to implement strong wholistic service-delivery that leaves youth more engaged and with an improved overall wellbeing. Cassandra has worked with youth in various capacities throughout her career and values the shared learning experiences that come with it. When not working you can find her cuddled up on the couch with her pets, dancing, practicing yoga or out in nature taking a hike & soaking up some sunshine.
